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This workshop presents some of the fundamental principles of color theory. Topics covered will be the color wheel and how to use it, value and proportional color. Cut and paste exercises with fabric will be used to illustrate the principles covered.

TOOLS/MATERIALS:

- **Scissors:** both for paper and fabric.
- **Rotary cutter, mat and ruler:** a 4"x 12" or 6" square ruler will suffice along with a small to medium sized cutting mat.
- **Value finder (optional):** this tool (available at art supply stores and some quilt shops) is not necessary for the class but a very useful thing to have. It is a strip of cardboard with ten steps of gray scale arranged five on either side with a keyhole cut into each.
- **Color wheel (optional):** available at quilt shops, this tool is also optional, as you will be building your own color wheel out of fabric (but it, too, is nice to have).
- **Binder (optional):** sheet protectors will be provided in the kit, but a binder will give you a good place keep your completed assignments in order
- **A pencil or pen:** to take notes if desired.
- **Kit (provided by the teacher):** the kit contains a packet of pre-selected fabrics to carry out the assignments, the assignment sheets, sheet protectors and a glue stick. **Cost of kit: \$20 per student**
